- Facilitated group study sessions for specific courses, including activities for the differing strengths of students. This allowed flexibility in sessions and catered to the many strengths of attendees.
- Designed presentations and activities for each session. Presentations included descriptions of activities, videos, and other resources to help students achieve their study goals with different forms of studying. These presentations provided visual information for students to fully understand the sessions and what was occurring and expected during these sessions.
- Created weekly, detailed plans of sessions. Plans included the amount of time per section, detailed descriptions, as well as detailing which specific form of active recall it utilized. This gave structure to sessions and allowed for collaborative feedback between peers.
- Observed weekly meetings in which how to make improvements on sessions were discussed. This included presentations on cultural awareness, mental health, and how to direct students to the proper campus resource that could help them. This provided collaboration with peers, as well as time to improve sessions and incorporate new activities into sessions each week.
